Stranded Myanmar nationals in Australia, New Zealand brought back home by relief flight

MYANMAR nationals stranded in Australia and New Zealand due to suspension of international flights were repatriated by relief flight yesterday.

The Myanmar National Airlines-MNA flight carrying 90 Myanmar nationals stranded in Australia and 16 people and 30 seamen in New Zealand landed at the Yangon International Airport yesterday evening.

At the Yangon International Airport, officials of Ministry of Labour, Immigration and Population, Ministry of Health and Sports and Yangon Region Government have provided them with arrangements for 21-day quarantine and medical check-ups in efforts to prevent the coronavirus infection.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs is working in line with the directives from the National-Level Central Committee

on Prevention, Control and Treatment of COVID-19 to bring back Myanmar nationals stranded abroad due to the suspension of international flights. So far, four relief flights have been operated to date from Australia.—MNA

42 new cases of COVID-19 reported on 30 August, total figure reaches 775

MYANMAR'S COVID-19 positive cases reached 775 after 42 new cases were reported on 30 August according to Ministry of Health and Sports. Among these 775 confirmed cases, six died, 352 have recovered, 347 have been discharged from hospitals and 53 were held under investigation.—MNA ■

MoRAC donates Waso robes, cash for meals at monasteries

Offertories were presented and ‘soon’ endowments were donated to the Members of Sangha in conjunction with the Waso robe offering ceremonies at the Parayatti monasteries.

Union Minister for Religious Affairs and Culture Thura U Aung Ko, Department of Religious Affairs Director-General U Myint Oo, Deputy Director-General U Tun Nyunt and officials took the Five Precepts from Pali University Nyaungdon Pariyatti Monastery’s Presiding Sayadaw Agga Maha Pandita Bhaddanta Pavarabhivamsa.

At the ceremony, the Union Minister said: “All countries around the world are striving to curb the spread of coronavirus with various methods, and are making efforts to produce vaccines.”

The Government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar’s National-Level Central Committee on Prevention, Control and Treatment of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID – 19) is also trying to contain the spread of COVID-19 in the country with

Pahtamapyam Exam results were announced on 28 August and Dhammacariya Exam results were declared on 30 August.

Pahtamapyam Exam pass rate is 82.04 per cent, and

Dhammacariya Exam pass rate is 76.43 per cent. The figures showed that this year’s pass rates are higher than last year’s.

During COVID-19, Ministry of Religious Affairs and Culture has been donating ‘soon’ endowments to Pariyatti monasteries so that Members of Sangha and nuns, who are learning Dhamma texts, do not have any difficulties and worries about ‘soon’.

Section 58 (d) in Hluttaw Election Law

IN accordance with section 58 (d) of the Hluttaw Election Law, no one is allowed to give speeches at meetings, instigation, writing, distribution of using posters or attempting by other means to disturb the voting or election. Anyone who is found guilty of or abet this act shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or with fine not exceeding K100,000 (one hundred thousand Kyats), or with both.

Advance voting process for local voters outside their constituencies in 2020 General Election

- Heads of trainings, schools, hospitals and jails are to contact the sub-election commissions to get documents of Form 15.
- They must return these documents to sub-commission of respective townships by 26 August 2020 after the documents are filled by the voters.
- Sub-election commission of respective townships must send ballot papers and envelopes for advance voting to the trainings, schools, hospitals and jails by 7 October 2020.
- Advance voting must be organized at trainings, schools, hospitals and jails on their appropriate day from 8 October 2020 to 21 October 2020.
- The envelopes containing ballot papers must be sent back to sub-election commission of respective townships by 4 pm on 8 November 2020.

Union Minister Dr Myint Htwe calls for public cooperation in control of COVID-19 in Rakhine

DURING a videoconference on prevention and control of COVID-19 in the Rakhine State held yesterday morning, Union Minister for Health and Sports Dr Myint Htwe called for public cooperation in prevention and control of COVID-19 and urged officials to prevent illegal entry to the Rakhine State via illegal border crossing.

The Union Minister point-

ed out that the spread of COVID-19 in the Rakhine State is too rapid, so effective decisions and responses should be made in real-time to control the outbreak. He said that the ministry has been effectively using digital technology to contact relevant officials in the Rakhine State in order to control the spread of the disease.

The Union Minister also

highlighted that it is important to prevent the COVID-19 outbreak in Rakhine spreading to the rest of the country.

He said that quarantines were arranged for all travellers from the Rakhine State. He continued that medical teams and medical supplies are delivering to the Rakhine State via special flights.

Currently, tasks to control

the disease have been carried out in real-time in accordance with the direct instructions of the National-Level Central Committee for Prevention, Control and Treatment of Coronavirus Disease 2019, according to Dr Myint Htwe.

The objective of the videoconference is to discuss real situation in the Rakhine State, to obtain suggestions from health officials, specialists and the Rakhine State Minister for Social Welfare, and to provide necessary assistance, said Dr Myint Htwe.

Discussions on control of COVID-19 in the Rakhine State will be held every morning, according to Dr Myint Htwe.

During the virtual meeting, Rakhine State Minister for Social Welfare Dr Chan Tha discussed various matters including COVID-19 control activities in the state, relevant management issues, and arranging buildings to receive more patients.

Rakhine State Public Health Department Chief Dr Sai Win Zaw Hlaing and leader of a medical team Director (Epidemiology) Dr Nyan Win Myint also

explained about health situations in the Rakhine State and made detailed suggestions.

Main subjects discussed in the videoconference are making necessary arrangements to be able to use a nursing and midwifery training school, a traditional medicine hospital, the Sittway University and the Rakhine State parliament building as temporary clinics for COVID-19 patients, installation of GeneXpert instrument system to conduct laboratory tests in Sittway, Kyaukpyu, Thandwe, Mrauk-U and Maungtau, arranging more quarantine centers, safety of health workers, discrimination and harassment against health workers who provided healthcare services to COVID-19 patients, the plan to deliver two new GeneXpert machines to the Kyaukpyu Hospital, the plan to install an oxygen plant in Sittway and Kyaukpyu apiece, and the plan to contact those who travelled from Rakhine State to Yangon from August 10 and arrange quarantine for them.—MNA

Taninthayi Fisheries Dept warns fishing boats to follow vessel monitoring rules

Taninthayi Region Fisheries Department has warned onshore and offshore fishing boats to comply with the Vessel Monitoring System-VMS as the authorities is taking steps to fight against illegal fishing and to conserve fishing resource in the water territory of the country.

The officials of the department held a meeting with the owners of the fishing boats in Dawei yesterday and explained the rules for the VMS system

installed at the fishing boats and legal action to be taken against those who violate the rules.

According the rules, fishing boats which are in the sea are obliged to contact the region's VMS monitoring centre and to give their location to the authorities while fishing in the sea.

The rules have also banned removing and changing the VMS system on the boats.

Vessel monitoring systems (VMS) have been installed on a

total of 1,414 offshore boats and 116 fish collecting vessels so far, while some vessels have been issued warnings regarding their installation.

The Taninthayi Vessel Monitoring System Control Centre is keeping a careful watch on offshore fishing vessels in Myanmar waters, according to the Fisheries Department.

The Taninthayi coast is situated in southern Myanmar and it is the longest coast in Myanmar,

spanning 200 miles. More than 47,000 workers are engaged in offshore fishing on 1,530 vessels

along the coast.—Dawei District IPRD (Translated by Kyaw Zin Lin)

MoLIP working to lessen COVID-19 impacts on workers, businesses : Union Minister U Thein Swe

UNION Minister for Labour, Immigration and Population U Thein Swe said that his ministry has been working to reduce the impact of COVID-19 on workers and businesses as well as issuing citizenship scrutiny cards for workers.

The Union Minister made the remarks in the meeting with the Confederation of Trade Unions in Myanmar (CTUM), the Agriculture and Farmer Federation of Myanmar (AFFM-IUF), and the Myanmar Industries Craft & Services Trade Unions Federation (MICS-TUsF) held at Kanaung Hall in Hlinethaya In-

dustrial Zone in Yangon Region yesterday morning.

The meeting was attended by Yangon Region Minister for Immigration and Human Resources Daw Moe Moe Su Kyi, Director General of Labour Department U Win Shein, officials from the department, CTUM Chairperson U Maung Maung, AFFM-IUF Chairperson U Zarni Thwe, MICS-TUsF General Secretary U Thet Hnin Aung and representatives from workers federations.

During the meeting, the Union Minister said that his ministry has been trying to reduce

the impact of COVID-19 on job opportunities and workers by trying to maintain regular operations of the ministry. He pointed out that many factories had to be shut down or reduced number of workers because of several reasons including lack of raw materials and not receiving orders as the impact of COVID-19. Moreover, the country cannot send any laborers abroad amid the crisis. The Union Minister said that his ministry is taking necessary measures to resolve the issues. The ministry also carried out the tasks to set minimum wages, he said.

The Ministry has focused on stability of job opportunities, workplace safety, capacity development of workers, and promotion of foreign investments, said the Union Minister.

The Union Minister commended workers federations for providing emergency food assistance to their members, and following the COVID-19 preventive guidelines set by the Ministry of Health and Sports.

Speaking on issuing citizenship scrutiny cards to workers, the Union Minister said that under Thitsa Project, officers and staff from his ministry visited

factories and issued the identity cards for the workers there so that the workers would not lose their voting rights. He said that the ministry is always monitoring the needs of employers and employees, and urged all to work collaboratively to overcome the challenges during the crisis.

CTUM Chairperson U Maung Maung then explained about various matters including workplace safety, social welfare for migrant workers, creating job opportunities, training, COVID-19 preventive measures and effectively resolving labour disputes. AFFM-IUF Chairperson U Zarni Thwe explained about his federation's activities in the third quarter of this year. MICS-TUsF General Secretary U Thet Hnin Aung discussed matters related to setting minimum wages, COVID-19 related measures, issuing identity cards and other related matters. Director General of Labour Department U Win Shein explained about the works done by his department.

Then, the Union Minister coordinated on matters and delivered a concluding speech.—MNA *(Translated by Maung Maung Swe)*

473 Myanmar migrant workers return home through Myawady border

A total of 473 Myanmar migrant workers returned home through the Thai-Myanmar Friendship Bridge No 2 in Myawady Border yesterday amidst COVID-19.

Kayin State Hluttaw Representative U Thant Zin Aung, Myawady District Administrator U Tay Zar Aung and local authorities helped the returnees with

medical tests and other supplies.

A total of 71,167 Myanmar citizens have returned home so far since 1 May. Local authorities are closely supervising the process of accepting the returnees in line with the COVID-19 guidelines. The latest group of returnees included 290 males and 183 females from different regions and

Rice export through sea trade up by \$174 mln as of mid-August

MYANMAR'S rice export through sea trade generated an estimated income of US\$618.016 million as of 14 August in the current financial year, and the figures reflect an increase of \$174.226 million compared with a year-ago period, as per data from Myanmar Rice Federation (MRF).

Myanmar's maritime trade constituted 84 per cent of rice exports.

Earlier, border trade was relatively high compared to sea trade in terms of rice exports. Since the previous budget year, border trade has dropped, and currently, it accounts for just 14 per cent of the total rice exports. Rice exports through the borders have generated an estimated \$108 million in the current financial year, which plunged from \$179.78 million registered in the corresponding period of last year.

The volume of rice and broken rice, which was exported between 1 October and 14 August in the 2019-2020FY, has registered at over 2.39 million metric tons, worth over \$726 million, stated MRF announcement.

In the current financial year, Myanmar has shipped rice to 66 foreign markets.

China is the leading buyer of Myanmar rice, followed by Malaysia and Madagascar. The Philippines is the fourth-largest buyer and Guinea becomes the fifth-largest buyer of Myanmar

rice.

Meanwhile, Myanmar has exported broken rice mostly to Belgium, followed by China, Senegal, Indonesia and the Netherlands. Broken rice has been placed in 60 foreign markets.

ASEAN countries constitute 18 per cent of Myanmar's

total rice exports. The European Union countries account for 20 per cent of rice exports, while 29 per cent of total rice exports in Myanmar goes to African countries, followed by China with 28 per cent.

Myanmar primarily exports rice to China through the bor-

ders. However, trading in agricultural products has been halted on account of China clamping down on illegal trade and China's precautionary measures to contain the spread of coronavirus.

The General Administration of Customs of the People's Republic of China (GACC) granted licences to 43 Myanmar companies on 10 July 2020 to export the rice to China through a legitimate trade channel. The Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation, the Ministry of Commerce and MRF jointly conducted training related to standard operating procedures for rice export for 108 trainees from 43 companies on 15 August.

According to the work coordination meeting held on 26 June, 100,000 tonnes of rice will be sent to the external market in September.

Myanmar shipped 3.6 million tonnes of rice in the 2017-2018 financial year, which was an all-time record in rice exports. The export volume plunged to 2.29 million tonnes, worth \$691 million, in the 2018-2019FY.—GNLM

Commerce Ministry issues 2021 vehicle import policy

UNDER the 2021 vehicle import policy, 2019 will be the oldest model to be given an import permit for private cars with non-commercial purpose, according to the press release of the Commerce Ministry.

Except for machinery, all import vehicles must be left-hand drive under the 2021 vehicle import policy.

When vehicles with engines under 1,350 CC are individually imported, the model year must be 2019 and later. Passengers vehicles such as mini-bus, city bus, express bus and commercial trucks manufactured in 2017 and later can be imported.

Under FOC Free-of-Charge licence system, fire trucks, ambulances and hearse vehicles manufactured in 2012 or later are allowed for import.

Heavy machineries that cannot be driven on public roads such as excavators, bulldozers, wheel loaders, vibratory roller, clamp loader, motor grader, road roller compactor, bridge crane, gantry crane, tower

crane, pilling machine, crawler drill/crane, mobile crane, rough-terrain crane, forklift, boom lift and asphalt finisher are allowed to be brought into the country as long as they are 15 years old or less.

Myanmar cuts tariff on import of private cars and Semi-Knocked Down vehicles amid COVID-19 the impacts. This move is likely to bring down the prices of vehicles with engines above 1,500 CC. The dealers pointed out that the price is possible to drop by K2 to 15 million depending on vehicle brand and specifications.

In a bid to remedy the businesses slowdown caused by the COVID-19 impacts, the government has brought tax cuts on the importation of private cars with non-commercial purpose and SKD vehicles assembled in Myanmar starting from 1 August, according to notification of the Ministry of Planning, Finance and Industry released on 29 July.

The government lowered

custom duty from 30 to 20 per cent on imported private cars with the engine under 2,000 CC and 40 to 30 per cent on cars with 2,001 CC and above. Meanwhile, the locally assembled vehicles under the SKD system were totally exempted from 10 per cent tax. Additionally, tariffs on SKD vehicles with 2001 CC and above were reduced from 20 to 5 per cent.

Additionally, starting from 7 August, registration fees at the Road Transport Administration Department (RTAD) on FOB price of the private vehicles were reduced from 30 to 15 per cent for vehicles with 1,500 CC and above, 50 to 25 per cent for vehicles with 1,351-2,000 CC, 80 to 40 per cent for cars with 2,001-5,000 CC and 120 to 60 per cent for cars with 5,001 CC and above respectively, the RTAD stated.

However, tax cuts still do not cover special goods tax, commercial tax and income tax to hold the vehicle ownership status.—Ko Khant

Myanmar attracts K9,812-bln domestic investments under incumbent government

THE domestic investments of over K9,812.6 billion made by Myanmar citizens have brought into the country over four years of the incumbent government, according to the Directorate of Investment and Company Administration (DICA).

A total of 558 domestic enterprises put investments of K9,812.6 billion into Myanmar between 2016-2017 financial year and 2019-2020FY (as of July-end).

Those domestic investments permitted by Myanmar Investment Commission (MIC) and endorsed by the respective region and state investment committees flow into the following 12 sectors: oil and gas, power, transport and communications, real estate, hotels and tourism, mining, livestock and fisheries, industrial estate, agriculture, construction, manufacturing and other service

sectors.

Of them, the real estate development sector has pulled the most massive domestic investments, followed by other service sectors in the second place and manufacturing sector in the third place.

Although Myanmar's economy is affected by the coronavirus impacts, domestic and foreign investments are growing in the current financial year. The existing enterprises have seen the expansion of capitals and an increase in the labour force, the MIC stated.

The Ministry of Investment and Foreign Economic Relations is inviting responsible businesses so the country benefits. The MIC is screening the investment projects at the soonest according to the COVID Economic Relief Plan.—GNLM

SWRR Ministry discusses COVID-19 containment measures in Rakhine State

THE Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement yesterday organized a virtual meeting on effective implementation of the ministry's works in Rakhine State abiding by COVID-19 rules.

Union Minister Dr Win Myat Aye, Deputy Minister U Soe Aung, Directors-General and relevant departments' directors for Rakhine State attended the meeting.

Speaking at the meeting, the Union Minister said that it is important to keep on undertaking the ministry's works as part of COVID-19 Economic Relief Plan (CERP) and as part of preparation for COVID-19 control measures in Rakhine State that began since March 2020.

The ministry was conducting COVID-19 awareness programmes and providing assistance including water and accommodations for vulnerable people at IDP camps, he added.

He said the National Volunteers Steering Committee Secretary Office to keep on investigating the ground condition requirements in making arrangements for volunteers.

The ministry needs greater capacity to implement COVID-19 containment measures as confirmed cases of coronavirus in Rakhine State are rising at present, he added calling for a round of discussions on fulfilling the ministry's duties in accordance with the rules issued during COVID-19.

The attendees discussed matters relating to temporary visits of experienced officials and staff to Rakhine State for

assistance, accommodations and foods for staff, strictly abiding by COVID-19 guidelines in serving duties, and distributing protective materials in a sufficient manner.

They detailed about systematic cooperation between sent volunteers and local volunteers at quarantine centres, ways to protect volunteers from infections, and getting sufficient amounts of quality personal protective equipment (PPEs).

The meeting also discussed arrangements for avoiding delay in providing assistance under COVID-19 Economic Relief Plan because of COVID-19 and undertaking the works in cooperation with Rakhine State government, General Administration Department, relevant departments and Civil society organizations (CSOs) in Rakhine State. — MNA

Myanmar imports fuel oil by 500,000 tonnes up this 2019-2020 financial year against the year-ago period

MYANMAR imported nearly US\$2.37 billion worth 5 million tonnes of diesel and gasoline over the past ten months of the current financial year, showing an increase of 500,000 tonnes compared to the corresponding period of last year, according to the Ministry of Commerce.

However, the import values stood at \$2.67 billion during a year-ago period, and the figures reflect a decrease of about \$300 million this year, said an official of the Ministry of Commerce.

The oil and gas sector has been crashed during COVID-19 outbreak. Oil price went negative on 20 April as there is no place to store all the crude the world is producing, but not using. The global market remains

broken, leading domestic oil price plunge to more than 50 per cent in April against January's prices.

Consequently, domestic oil prices have been on the decline since 10 January 2020 owing to a fall in global oil prices. On 8 January 2020, oil prices were pegged at around K905 per litre for Octane 92, K995 for Octane 95 and K985 for diesel and premium diesel.

Then, the prices in the domestic market have extended its drop in May.

On 22 April 2020, the oil prices touched a low of K290-330 per litre for Octane 92, K430-455 for Octane 95, K435-465 for diesel and K445-475 for premium diesel, according to the domestic oil market.

"Domestic oil price is positively related to the global market," said a trader.

Oil price inched higher in the global market in August. In the global markets, oil prices stood at around US\$45.8 per barrel for Brent oil and \$42 per barrel for WTI crude oil on 30 August 2020.

The domestic fuel oil market showed a slight increase in oil prices in early August compared with late April.

At present, the domestic oil market has recovered a bit. The fuel oil was pegged at around at K505-535 for Octane 92, K635-645 for Octane 95 and K555-585 for diesel and K565-595 for premium diesel on 30 August in the domestic retail market, according to the local

fuel oil market.

On 10 October 2018, due to an increase in global crude oil prices and the weakening of the Kyat against the US dollar, oil prices had touched a high of K1,065 per litre for Octane 92, K1,115 for Octane 95, K1,085 for diesel, and K1,105 for premium diesel.

Myanmar imports 90 per cent of fuel oil and produces the remaining 10 per cent locally.

Usually, Myanmar imports fuel oil primarily from Singapore, with monthly volumes touching 200,000 tonnes for gasoline and 400,000 tonnes for diesel. There are about 2,000 fuel stations and 50 oil importer companies in Myanmar.—Ko Htet

THE RACE TO SUCCEED TO PM ABE

Japan planning to pick new premier in parliament on Sept. 17

JAPAN is planning to hold an extraordinary parliamentary session on Sept. 17 to pick the country's new prime minister, a source with knowledge of the situation said Sunday.

Following Prime Minister Shinzo Abe's announcement Friday of his impending resignation for health reasons, the ruling Liberal Democratic is now making final arrangements to hold its presidential election on Sept. 14, according to the source.

Meanwhile, Chief Cabinet Secretary Yoshihide Suga will join the race to succeed Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, ruling party lawmakers said Sunday, as they are seeking continuity in dealing with major issues amid the coronavirus pandemic.

Suga, who has been top government spokesman since Abe's

return to power in late 2012, told Liberal Democratic Party Secretary General Toshihiro Nikai of his intention to run in the party leadership election, possibly to be held Sept. 14, according to the lawmakers.

Japan is planning to hold an extraordinary parliamentary session on Sept. 17 to pick the country's new prime minister, an LDP source with knowledge of the situation said.

Suga may publicly announce his intention to run in the election on Tuesday, while the source said the party is making final arrangements to kick off the race for the top job on Sept. 8.

On Friday, Abe, Japan's longest-serving premier, said he will step down after seven years and eight months in office, citing the worsening of his chronic in-

testinal illness.

Fumio Kishida, LDP policy chief and a former foreign minister, and Shigeru Ishiba, a former defense minister, have also indicated their desire to run to replace Abe as leader of the ruling party and prime minister.

Suga told Nikai on Saturday night that he "wants to make a formal announcement after the date for the election is fixed," according to the lawmakers. The LDP is set to convene a meeting to decide on the schedule on Tuesday.

Nikai, who has been delegated by Abe to make decisions on the leadership race as the party's No. 2, encouraged Suga to take part in the election, one of the lawmakers said.

Coronavirus forces London tourist guides to adapt

"I don't know if you're aware, but we're living through a pandemic right now," says Joel Robinson with a smile as he introduces his Jack the Ripper tour in London's East End.

Robinson, a trained actor and history buff who works for the tourist company London With A Local, goes on to explain social distancing best practice to his nine clients.

Although he doesn't wear them himself, he advises the tourists to wear masks and gloves before they set off through the once-gloomy alleyways of Victorian-era London.

Down darkened side streets

and past shiny new buildings, Robinson recounts the tale of the still unidentified serial killer of five women who stalked the streets of Whitechapel in 1888.

London's tourist guides are resuming their work slowly as lockdown restrictions are eased, and adapting to new health and safety rules to curb the spread of the virus. Numbers are currently limited but it's the background of the clients that has changed the most. Where before Robinson and walking guides like him played mainly to foreign tourists, now customers are mainly British. Dwindling numbers of overseas clients are largely down to

quarantine measures imposed by the British government on foreign visitors.

"We have far more Britons than we had," said Olivia Calvert, one of Robinson's colleagues. "It's a huge shift. They're expecting something else, something different." Among the home-grown tourists traipsing around the Ripper's old haunts are Anne and Nick Garner, a couple in their fifties from near Manchester, in northwest England.


"We would have been abroad but we decided to come to London," said Anne Garner after her insight into the bloodthirsty past of the city's East End.

Getting creative

The 90-minute Jack the Ripper tour is one of London's most popular, alongside the Harry Potter tour and another visiting the sex, drugs and rock 'n' roll hotspots of Soho.

"The British already know London's famous monuments, so they expect something else," said Calvert. Antony Robbins is an independent guide affiliated to the Guild of Tourist Guides, the national professional association for Blue Badge Tourist Guides across the country.

Premier League chief hails fans pilot event

PREMIER League chief executive Richard Masters has hailed a test event for the partial return of supporters as a success, after 2,500 fans attended Brighton's friendly with Chelsea.

Strict social-distancing measures were in place for Saturday's 1-1 draw in the pre-season friendly at the Amex Stadium. It was the first time fans had been allowed into a Premier League ground since the top-flight was suspended in March due to the coronavirus. The competition resumed in June behind closed doors.

Saturday's match was one of a number of trial events announced by the government for a phased return of spectators across a range of sports.

"Brighton and Hove Albion did a fantastic job at their test event for the return of supporters and it was great to see fans in a Premier League stadium for the first time since March," said Masters.

"The success of having 2,500 supporters in the Amex was very encouraging and we are committed to having full stadia as soon as possible, with safety always our priority. We are working hard alongside our clubs, the government and the safety authorities to achieve this."

Brighton chief executive Paul Barber said the event went smoothly. "Credit to our fans -- they followed the guidelines, listened to requests from our stewards and, even at the end, when they stayed on to listen to the managers' pitchside interviews on our stadium screens, they remained in their seats and observed social distancing."

On Sunday the government announced the formation of the Sport Tech Innovation Group, which will include the Premier League and other sporting bodies, to explore high-tech solutions to allow more fans into stadiums. Secretary of State for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport Oliver Dowden said this weekend marked "an important milestone" in the recovery of sport.

"I am doing everything I can to get fans back in the stands, following the teams and enjoying the sports they love," he said. "Sport's economic health depends on their return to stadiums, too."

"We have blown the starting whistle on fans returning safely but our work is not done until every fan is back where they belong," he added.

The new Premier League season starts behind closed doors on September 12.—AFP ■

The strategy adopted is to seek the help of the people to provide information about the spread and use of drugs. A complaint mechanism has been set up in the form of Drug Activity Special Complaint Department for receiving complaints of drug activity with full protection provided to the person or persons giving the information related to using, distributing and selling illegal drugs. It protects the identity of the informers so that they may not be targeted by revenge seeking people in the drug distribution chain. People have been increasingly providing information about the use, movements and distribution of the narcotic drugs. They sometimes lead to

the bigger branches if not to the "Trunk" itself. On some occasions "Big Branches" have been "cut down". But presumably the Tree Trunk have not been felled though efforts continue. Another strategy Myanmar has adopted is to team up with International Agencies to cut down the cultivated areas of "Poppy". The rationale is that, if the supply is reduced so will be the demand.

SEEING A SURGE IN CORONAVIRUS CASES

Global virus cases cross 25 million as India sets grim record

GLOBAL coronavirus infections soared past 25 million on Sunday (Aug 30), as countries around the world further tightened restrictions to try to stop the rampaging pandemic.

A million additional cases have been detected globally roughly every four days since mid-July, according to an AFP tally, with India on Sunday setting the record for the highest single-day rise in cases with 78,761.

The surge in India, home to 1.3 billion people, came as the government further eased lockdown restrictions on the weekend to help ease pressure on the reeling economy.

Even nations such as New Zealand and South Korea, which had previously brought their outbreaks largely under control, are now battling new clusters of infections.

On the other side of the world, Latin America - the worst-hit region - was still struggling with its first wave, with Covid-19 deaths


in Brazil crossing 120,000, second only to the United States.

Brazil's curve "has stabilised now, but at a very dangerous level: nearly 1,000 deaths and 40,000 cases per day," said Christovam Barcellos, a researcher at public health institute FioCruz.

"And Brazil still isn't past the peak."

Nearly 843,000 people have died of Covid-19 globally, and with no vaccine or effective treatment available yet, governments have been forced to resort to some form of social distancing and lockdowns to stop the spread of the virus. Masks will become mandatory from Monday on public transport and flights in New Zealand, which went more than 100 days without local transmission before the current cluster emerged.

And tightened virus curbs kicked in on Sunday in South Korea, which is also battling fresh clusters - including in the greater Seoul region, home to half the country's population.

'ANTI-CORONA' RALLIES IN EUROPE'

Despite the grim numbers, there has been steady opposition to lockdowns and social distancing measures in many parts of the world, often because of their

crushing economic cost.

But resistance has also come from the extreme right and left of the political spectrum, as well as conspiracy theorists and anti-vaccine campaigners.

In Berlin on Saturday, around

18,000 people gathered to march against coronavirus restrictions - but police later stopped the rally because many were not respecting social distancing measures.

Protesters waved German flags and shouted slogans against

Chancellor Angela Merkel often used by the far-right Alternative for Germany (AfD) party.

Similar protests were held in London and Zurich, where some carried signs supporting the far-right QAnon movement, which promotes bizarre theories about Satan-worshipping cabals and "deep state" plots - without any credible evidence.

'A BIG FIRST STEP'

The pandemic has upended economies and societies around the world, and halted most large gatherings - from sport and music to religion and politics.

The Tour de France set off from the French Riviera on Saturday, two months later than planned and with the French sport minister not ruling out the cancellation of the event because of the coronavirus.

Landmark protest in Mauritius over giant oil spill

TENS of thousands of Mauritians protested Saturday in the capital Saint-Louis over the government's handling of a giant oil spill off its pristine Indian Ocean coast.

The Japanese bulk carrier MV Wakashio crashed into a reef off southeastern Mauritius last month spewing more than 1,000 tonnes of oil into waters that are home to mangrove forests and endangered species.

After the boat split in two, the larger piece was towed out to sea and sunk, but the smaller section remains stranded on the reef.

The call for the march came from an ordinary citizen, Jean Bruneau Laurette, who has become a hero among many for daring to oppose Prime Minister Pravind Jugnauth.

Laurette, a maritime security expert, says the government has been hiding the truth about the circumstances of the oil

spill. He has filed a case against the environment ministry.

Up to 75,000 protesters thronged the square in front

of the cathedral in downtown Port-Louis, an AFP reporter said, in the biggest demonstration in 40 years.

Many of them were dressed in black -- the colour of mourning. Public anger has boiled over in Mauritius after at least

34 melon-headed whales were found dead or seriously ill near the site of the spill.

Fisheries minister Sudheer Maudhoo had said there was "no trace of hydrocarbons on them or in their respiratory system".

"This rally is an occasion to send a message to tell Pravind Jugnauth he has messed up," marcher Jocelyne Leung, 35, told AFP.

"This is the first time that a citizens' demonstration has gathered such a big crowd," said Ajay Guinness, the number two of the opposition MMM party.

Many protesters carried the national flag, sang the national anthem, and called for Jugnauth to step down.

Authorities and experts from Japan and Britain are still investigating the true extent of the ecological damage to an island whose economy depends heavily on tourism.—AFP ■

ESSENTIAL TO THE FUTURE OF HUMANITY?

Musk shows off progress merging brains and machines

FUTURIST entrepreneur Elon Musk late Friday demonstrated progress made by his Neuralink startup in meshing brains with computers, saying the work is essential to the future of humanity.

Musk has long contended that a neural lace merging minds with machines is vital if people are going to avoid being so outpaced by artificial intelligence that, under the best of circumstances, humans would be akin to "house cats."

"It's gonna be important from an existential threat standpoint," Musk said of the project.

"That is what I think might be the most important thing that a device like this achieves."

Members of the team shared a "wish list" that ranged from the technology returning mobility to the paralyzed and sight to the blind, to enabling telepathy and the uploading of memories for later reference -- or perhaps to be downloaded into replacement bodies.

"Yes, I think in the future you will be able to save and replay memories," Musk said.

"This is obviously sound-

ing increasingly like a 'Black Mirror' episode, but I guess they are pretty good at predicting," he quipped, referring to a Netflix series that puts disturbing twists on near-future technology.

For now, Neuralink is being tested in pigs with the team working on the potential for clinical trials.

A trio of pigs in pens took part in the demonstration: one of them named Gertrude was said to have been implanted with a Neuralink device wired to detect spikes in nerve activity in her snout.

Gertrude happily focused on food, mostly ignoring Musk and others gathered for the event.

Musk said that since the first version of Neuralink was revealed slightly more than a year ago, the device has been simplified and reduced to about the size of a large coin and the thickness of the skull.

With the help of a surgical robot, a piece of the skull is replaced with a Neuralink disk, and its wispy wires are strategically inserted into the brain, the demonstration showed.

Transparent stalls transform image of public toilets in Tokyo

RESTROOMS with transparent stalls opened in parks in Tokyo's Shibuya district in August, challenging the stereotypes of dirty and dangerous public toilets.

Users need not worry about being exposed to the outside world as the high-tech glass stalls in the toilets become opaque when locked.

When the toilets are not occupied, the glass stalls are transparent, enabling users to check for cleanliness and safety before entering. At night, they light up the parks like beautiful lanterns.

The colorful transparent toilets, designed by Shigeru Ban, the 2014 winner of the Pritzker Prize, an annual international award for architects, were installed in Yoyogi Fukamachi Mini Park and Haru-no-Ogawa Community Park in Shibuya, the bustling center of youth culture.

They are part of the Tokyo Toilet Project launched by the Nippon Foundation nonprofit organization in cooperation with Shibuya Ward to construct public toilets at 17 locations by the summer of 2021.

A total of 16 leading architects designed the toilets in the project, including Tadao Ando,

the winner of the 1995 Pritzker Prize, and Kengo Kuma, who designed the new National Stadium, the main venue for the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games, originally scheduled to be held this summer but postponed for one year due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Mihoko Ueki, project coordinator for the social innovation team at Nippon Foundation, said, "The use of public toilets in Japan is limited because of stereotypes that they are dark, dirty, smelly and scary."

The foundation decided to reimagine public toilets to counter such misgivings, according to Ueki.

The new toilets "will use advanced design to make them accessible for everyone regardless of gender, age, or disability to demonstrate the possibilities of an inclusive society," she said.

The photogenic, transparent toilets have immediately gone viral on social media, drawing mixed reviews from Twitter users.

new record in service speed of the area, which only took four months from signing to acquiring construction permits. Besides, Lin-gang Special Area is also making full efforts to promote the

reengineering of approval procedures, raising 26 measures to improve government and enterprise investment projects, which greatly facilitated the progress of these projects.—AFP

Ex-PM Lee Nak Yon elected as S. Korea ruling party's new chief

SEOUL — Former South Korean Prime Minister Lee Nak Yon, who served in the administration of President Moon Jae In, was elected the new chairman of the ruling Democratic Party on Saturday at a virtual party convention.

Lee, a four-term lawmaker who is considered as a leading candidate for the presidential race in 2022, won around 60 percent of the votes cast at the convention to defeat former Interior Minister and former four-term lawmaker Kim Boo Kyum and two-term lawmaker Rep. Park Ju Min.

Lee, who replaces outgoing chairman Lee Hae Chan, will have the task of rebooting the liberal party, which won the April 15 general election but has lost popularity over various issues like rising real estate prices and its handling of the National Assembly. — Kyodo

Death toll in China restaurant collapse climbs to 29

BEIJING — The number of people killed when a restaurant in northern China collapsed has climbed to 29, state media said on Sunday, with efforts to find survivors brought to a close.

The two-storey building in Xiangfen county, Shanxi province, came down on Saturday morning during an 80th birthday party, according to official news agency Xinhua.

A total of 57 people have been pulled from the debris of the Juxian restaurant, with dozens injured.

Seven people are seriously hurt, although Xinhua said the injuries were "not life-threatening."

State broadcaster CGTN said the rescue operation ended in the early hours of Sunday morning.

The cause of the collapse is unknown and the central government's State Council said it would supervise an investigation by provincial authorities.

Footage on the CGTN website showed the roof caved in, with rescue equipment lifting rubble from the site.

Rescuers in orange overalls and hard hats combed the crumbled ruin as a painting remained hanging on one of the few walls still intact. Seven hundred people were involved in the rescue operation, CGTN said.— AFP

Airstrikes smash Taliban explosive cache, court in N. Afghanistan

SARI PUL — A Taliban cache and a courthouse were destroyed by airstrikes in Afghanistan's northern Sari Pul province, the military said on Sunday.

"Following a heavy bombing by the Afghan airforce, a depot of Taliban militants packed with explosives, ammunition and arms were destroyed in the Suzma Qala district's Kata Qala area of Sari Pul on Saturday night," the army's Shaheen Corps 209 said in a statement.

The cache stored six AK-47 rifles, one rocket propelled grenade (RPG) launcher, 2,000 bullets, more than 70 kg explosive materials and several land mines, according to the statement.—Xinhua

India records world's highest single-day rise with more than 78,700 new COVID-19 cases

NEW DELHI: India recorded the world's highest single-day rise of COVID-19 cases on Sunday (Aug 30) with 78,761 new infections.

The spike in new cases, the highest reported by any nation since the pandemic began, surpassed a Jul 17 figure of 77,638 in the United States according to an AFP tally.

India, home to 1.3 billion people, is already the world's

third-most infected nation with more than 3.5 million cases, behind the US and Brazil.

In his regular monthly radio address on Sunday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi did not comment on the surge but called on Indians to observe health safety measures.

"It is important that every citizen is healthy and happy and we defeat coronavirus complete-

ly together," Modi said in Hindi.

"Corona (virus) can only be defeated when you remain safe, when you fulfil the resolve of keeping a safe distance of two yards and wearing masks."


Experts warn that while a ramp up in testing in recent months was encouraging, more needed to be done to capture the scale of the pandemic in the world's second-most populous

nation.

The virus has badly hit megacities such as financial hub Mumbai and the capital New Delhi, but is now also surging in smaller cities and rural areas.

Indian authorities on Saturday further eased coronavirus lockdown restrictions on even as cases and deaths surged across the country. — AFP

UK govt slumps in polls amid coronavirus chaos

LONDON — Britain's Conservative government was on Sunday level with the Labour party in the polls for the first time in over a year amid a series of embarrassing U-turns and economic devas-

tation wrought by the coronavirus pandemic.

Prime Minister Boris Johnson can expect little respite when parliament returns on Tuesday, with economic gloom and rows

over school returns and efforts to get workers back to the office set to dominate the agenda.

The Tories and Labour are now both polling at 40 percent, according to an Opinium poll pub-

lished in the Observer on Sunday, the first time they have been level since Johnson was elected leader last summer.

The Conservatives had a 26-point lead at the start of the coronavirus crisis, but criticism over the government's handling of the outbreak, which has claimed over 41,000 lives in Britain, and the economic fallout from the resulting lockdown has seen their popularity plunge.

"This is the first time Labour have drawn level since July 2019 when both main parties were in freefall," said Adam Drummond of Opinium.

"Since Boris Johnson became prime minister the Tories typically had a double digit lead, peaking in March/April this year when they were seen to be handling the pandemic and lockdown fairly well while Labour changed leader." The latest polling drop comes after a damaging two weeks of U-turns over school exam results.—AFP ■

German govt condemns 'unacceptable' attempt to storm Reichstag

BERLIN — The German government Sunday slammed the "unacceptable" behaviour of protesters during a mass rally against coronavirus restrictions in which hundreds were arrested and an attempt was made to storm the Reichstag parliament building.

The Reichstag is the "symbolic centre of our democracy", Interior Minister Horst Seehofer told Sunday's edition of the Bild newspaper: "It is unacceptable to see extremists and trouble-makers use it for their own ends."

Police said some 38,000 people, double the number expected, had gathered in Berlin on Saturday to protest restrictions imposed to curb the spread of the coronavirus, such as the wearing

of masks and social distancing.

Late Saturday, several hundred protesters broke through barriers and a police cordon to climb the steps leading to the entrance to the Reichstag.

They were narrowly prevented from entering the building by police, who used pepper spray and arrested several people.

Police initially appeared overwhelmed, as only a handful of officers were there to block the crowd.

"We cannot be present everywhere and it is precisely these weaknesses in the deployment that were exploited, in this case to cross the security barriers in order to reach the steps of the Reichstag," said local police spokesman Thilo Cablitz.—AFP ■

US prosecutors seek tough sentences for George Floyd cops

Prosecutors are seeking stiffer-than-usual sentences for four former US police officers charged over the killing of George Floyd, arguing that they showed "particular cruelty" to the handcuffed African American.

The 46-year-old resident of Minneapolis, Minnesota died in May after being pinned to the pavement under the knee of white officer Derek Chauvin as Floyd gasped that he could not breathe.

The case is proceeding

amid renewed fury over police violence against African Americans, galvanized by the shooting of Jacob Blake in Wisconsin this week.

Court papers filed Friday in the Floyd case indicate that the Minnesota attorney general's

office will argue there were a number of aggravating factors.

These include evidence that Chauvin knelt on Floyd's neck for almost nine minutes as bystanders, including multiple children, pleaded for his life and then watched him die.—AFP ■

One killed in Portland as Trump supporters clash with protesters

SAN FRANCISCO — One person was shot and killed on Saturday night in downtown Portland, the largest city in the U.S. state of Oregon, after tensions between a group of U.S. President Donald Trump's supporters and anti-racist protesters escalated, according to local police.

The incident took place at 8:46 p.m. local time (0346 GMT Sunday) as police officers "heard sounds of gunfire from the area of Southeast 3rd Avenue and Southwest Alder Street," said Portland Police Bureau in a statement. It said police officers have secured the entire block at the crime scene and are investigating the shooting as a homicide, adding "no suspect information is being released at this time."

"There have been some instances of violence between demonstrators and counter-demonstrators. Officers have intervened and in some cases made arrests," it tweeted.

Libya unity government names new defense officials after protests

TRIPOLI — The head of Libya's unity government on Saturday appointed a new defense minister and army chief, after days of protests against poor public services and living conditions.

The decrees followed the announcement hours earlier by Libya's UN-recognized Government of National Accord (GNA) that it had suspended its interior minister after militia gunmen fired on peaceful demonstrators last week. GNA chief Fayez Al-Sarraj promoted deputy and acting defense minister Salah Eddine Al-Namrush to the ministry's top job and appointed General Mohammad Ali Al-Haddad as head of the army.

Haddad hails from Misrata, 200 kilometers (125 miles) east of Tripoli, the home of powerful armed groups that have fought on the side of the GNA in the battle against eastern-based military strongman Khalifa Haftar, who tried to seize the capital last year.—AFP ■

Rules urged for personal-bag use in shops amid shoplifting fear

TOKYO — As customers increasingly bring their own bags to retail outlets following July's introduction of charges for plastic bags, guidelines for personal-bag use are being advocated to prevent their use to aid shoplifting.

Earlier this month, a Tokyo-based antishoplifting nonprofit organization created a poster urging customers to use shopping baskets provided by stores and to keep personal bags folded until after purchases are made.

It also counseled keeping bags containing products bought at other stores closed.

The move followed an alleged shoplifting case on Aug. 10, in which a man was arrested at a supermarket in the city of Tambasayama in western Japan's Hyogo Prefecture on suspicion of stealing in-

stant noodles after putting them into his bag.

According to a survey conducted by the organization in 2014, when incentives were already in place to encourage use of personal shopping bags, 117

out of 511 retail companies, or 22.9 percent, said they had experienced more shoplifting as a result.

Retailers and security guards have expressed concern that the problem could become even more

severe following July's introduction of charges for plastic bags. Japan's three largest convenience store operators said three-quarters of their customers did not buy plastic bags in July.—Kyodo ■

Virus lockdowns give major boost to e-commerce

LONDON — While large traditional retailers announce big lay-offs because of the pandemic, sometimes shedding thou-

sands of staff, coronavirus lockdowns have in contrast given e-commerce a major boost.

Recent data shows a

shift to shopping online -- according to Kantar consulting group, international e-commerce grew 41 percent in only three months compared with 22 percent growth for 2020 as a whole to date, as the pandemic "transformed" retail habits.

The trend was brought into sharp relief on August 18, when British high street mainstay Marks & Spencer announced it was culling 7,000 staff.

Hours later, in contrast, online behemoth Amazon said it was hiring 3,500 in the United States.

The M&S slimdown is only one part of the picture in the UK, with 2,500 more job losses announced at department store Debenhams, which in April entered administration for the second time in a year. Hundreds more jobs are also to be lost at other well known British high street chains.

By contrast, Britain's largest supermarket chain Tesco placed a sizeable feather in its online cap by saying it was creating 16,000 permanent jobs to deal with strong growth in its online activities.—AFP ■

Delhi Metro's new guidelines: What may change when services resume

NEW DELHI — After a hiatus of over five months, Delhi's lifeline - the metro trains - will resume services from 7 September. The Union Home Ministry on Saturday issued the Unlock 4 guidelines under

which metro trains will be allowed to resume services from September 7 in a graded manner.

The announcement came on a day when Delhi recorded 1,954 fresh Covid-19 cases, the city's

highest single-day spike in August till date, taking the tally to over 1.71 lakh. This is the highest number of cases in the last nearly 50 days. Minutes after the go-ahead from the Centre, the Delhi Metro

Rail Corporation (DMRC) issued a statement saying the protocols that need to be followed at the station and inside trains will be released after specific guidelines are issued by the Centre.—ANI ■

China's integrated circuit industry sees rapid growth in H1

BEIJING — China's integrated circuit (IC) industry maintained growth momentum despite the impact of the COVID-19 epidemic in the first half of this year (H1), according to the China Semiconductor Industry Association.

The industry's sales revenue totaled 353.9 billion yuan (about 51.37 billion U.S. dollars) in the January-June period, up 16.1 percent year on year, data from the association showed.

In breakdown, the design sector raked in 149.06 billion yuan in sales revenue with a year-on-year

growth of 23.6 percent, accounting for 42.1 percent of the total in the IC industry.

Meanwhile, the sales revenue of the manufacturing and packaging sectors logged a year-on-year growth of 17.8 percent and 5.9 percent, respectively.

According to the General Administration of Customs, the country's IC industry saw imports stand at 154.61 billion U.S. dollars in H1, up 12.2 percent year on year, while exports climbed 10.5 percent from one year earlier to 50.51 billion U.S. dollars.—Xinhua ■

Kaungdaw natural cave
Kaungdaw natural cave with a statue of a hunter known as Kaungdaw was really beautiful. Much thanks was owed to the locals and the head monk of a local monastery for maintaining the nature. We actually went quite deep into the cave hoping to reach the end but didn't dare to go any further beyond the point where electric lights were lit. The sight inside the cave was great with overhanging speleothems or cave formations but as we went deeper, there were waters on the ground so we beat a hasty retreat back to the mouth of the cave.

Taung Hti Bwar Cave and Wingabar Mountain
Wingabar Mountain was 3.5 miles (5.7 kilometre) from Pinlaung near the village of Taung Hti Bwar. The cave at Wingabar Mountain known as Yar Za Cave or Hti Bwar Cave was long with many paths making it confusing for some visitors to find the way in or out. This makes the visit to

the cave an exciting one. Most visitors can figure their way in or out so don't be too concerned about getting lost but you may choose to go along with some locals too.

Orange farm
Oranges from Pinlaung were good. Even though we went at a time when it was not available, we visited an orange farm. During winter time, the orange

tree will be full of oranges. A visit to an orange farm is one you must make if you ever made it to Pinlaung whether there are oranges or not.

Villages producing Pa-O traditional wicker ware
Villages producing Pa-O traditional wicker ware are must-visit places for any visitors, local or foreigner. Buying one as

a souvenir would be better still as all were within the range of K 1,000 to 5,000. Ask a local guide to show you around.

The guide will show you right into the homes where the wicker wares were produced. You will not only see first-hand how the wicker wares were produced but also how the locals live.

Pa-O lacquer ware

I was pleasantly surprised to find out that Pa-O had lacquer ware. Even though this practice was becoming close to extinction, it would be great if the locals continue to produce this useful handicrafts that at the least would be a very attractive souvenir for any visitors be they locals or foreigners.

Footprint of King Kyansittha

Ask a local guide to show you where a footprint said to be of King Kyansittha was. There were two footprints of the great King Kyansittha of Bagan at some distance from one another near Pinlaung.

Many more places of interests

There were many more

places of interests near Pinlaung like Sin Hsin Waterfall, Aye Chan Myay Resort, Haa Waterfall, Ywet Pone Thi (Pa-O) Coffee factory, Balu Chaung water hole and cave, Shan paper making works, Pa-O traditional light festival, Rain Calling Festival where locally produced rockets were fired to induce rain, Laneli Bridge and Nant Mon Waterfalls.

Use local guides to see all places of interests

In Myanmar, we used to say that if we ask we can reach any village and the same goes with any places too. But if you don't know what was there to see or visit, you wouldn't be able to ask and visit it. So it is best to get in touch with a local guide and work out in advance what can be seen or visited. Find out what can be seen and where to go and then decide what to see and where to go. On my part, I contacted a local guide and arranged my trip to Pinlaung and its neighbourhood. May all have a happy visit to Pinlaung and nearby places.

BARCELONA — Lionel Messi did not attend a pre-season medical with Barcelona on Sunday (Aug 30), Spanish media including sports daily Marca reported, following his shock announcement on Tuesday that he wants to leave the club. Reuters footage showed players arriving for coronavirus tests on Sunday morning and Messi did not appear. He had been due at Barcelona's training ground at 10.15am local time. Players had been given staggered appointments throughout the morning until midday.

Media reports on Saturday

said Argentine Messi would not undergo a pre-season medical or attend training on Monday.

The 33-year-old six-time world player of the year informed his lifelong club on Tuesday he wished to leave immediately, plunging Barca into new turmoil less than two weeks after their humiliating 8-2 Champions League quarter-final defeat by Bayern Munich. Messi's lawyers plan to invoke a clause in his four-year contract, signed in 2017, which would have allowed the forward to leave the club for free if he had requested it by Jun 10.—AFP ■

Aubameyang underlines value as Arsenal win Community Shield

LONDON — Mikel Arteta claimed Arsenal captain Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang is close to signing a new contract after the Gunners beat Liverpool 5-4 on penalties following a 1-1 draw in the Community Shield on Saturday. Aubameyang put Arteta's side ahead in the first half at Wembley with a typically eye-catching strike.

Japan's Takumi Minamino equalised with his first goal for Liverpool late in the second half of the annual pre-season friendly between the Premier League champions and FA Cup winners.

In the shoot-out, Liverpool's young striker Rhian Brewster was the only player to miss, hitting the bar with their third penalty before Aubameyang calmly dispatched the decisive spot-kick.

As if Arteta needed any reminding, it was another sign

of the influence wielded by his captain Aubameyang, who is yet to commit his long-term future to the club as he enters the final year of his contract. Gabon forward Aubameyang has kept Arsenal waiting nervously during protracted talks and he demurred when asked in a post-match interview if he was ready

to sign the club's contract offer.

"We are going to see, today we will just take the trophy and that is it," he said. Arteta has remained confident the 31-year-old will stay and he insisted his talisman's status will be resolved to his satisfaction before the Premier League season starts on September 12.—AFP ■

Public announcement for report on travel to/from townships of Rakhine State with positive cases to control COVID-19

The Ministry of Health and Sports has recorded 628 confirmed cases of COVID-19, including 6 deaths, in Myanmar until 08:00 hrs on 28-8-2020.

There are 216 COVID-19 positive patients who are living in Sittway, Rakhine State, and travelled to/from Sittway between 16-8-2020 and 28-8-2020 up to 08:00 hrs.

To be able to control the outbreak of disease without delay, people who travelled to/from Sittway and other townships in Rakhine State with positive cases since 10-8-2020 need to report about it immediately of their own volition.

The checklist of Ministry of Transport and Communications has shown the data of passengers who took local flights from Rakhine State to Yangon during this period. They need to inform to the nearest health centres, relevant departments and organizations for undergoing medical examinations.

Only then they could receive medical treatments if they have been infected with the disease and could prevent further transmission to the family members and nearby people. They are advised to undergo medical tests.

Actions will be taken against those who failed to report on it under the Natural Disaster Management Law.

COVID-19 Call Centre opens daily

In efforts to speed up the prevention, containment and treatment of the COVID-19 disease, the call centre (phone number 2019) is established by four communications operators and the Blue Ocean Company with the coordination of the Medical Research Department of the Health and Sports Ministry and Post and Telecommunications Department from 9 am to 5 pm daily at the Medical Research Department in Yangon.

Over 43 staff from the Medical Research Department and 17 volunteers from the Myanmar Medical Association totally 60 workers have been working at the centre since 8th April.—MNA
