Second Batch of Rice Seeds Delivered to Farmers of Mocha Cyclone Victims in Rakhine State to Plant Rice in Time for the Rainy Season



The Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation is planning to send baskets of rice seed to the farmers affected by Cyclone Mocha in Rakhine state so that they can plant rice in time for the rainy season as per the plan and guidance of the National Disaster Management Committee.

- On 29 June, the second batch of rice seeds were delivered: 14,425 Tins of GW11 rice seed that were bought from seed farmer groups and seed companies in Nay Pyi Taw Council Territory were delivered by using 65 Tatmadaw vehicles; 3,000 Tins of Paw San rice seeds that were brought from seed farmer groups and seed companies in Yangon

region were delivered by using 12 Tatmadaw vehicles; 13,067.5 Tins of Paw San rice seeds that were brought from seed farmer groups and seed companies in Myaungmya and Wakema townships of Ayeyarwady region were delivered by using 63 Tatmadaw vehicles respectively.

Local military personnel, Myanmar Police Force members and departmental officials helped load up the rice seeds to the vehicles. They were systematically handed over to officials in Rakhine state. They will also be distributed to the farmers in Rakhine state in time, it is reported.

The departmental officials from relevant Ministries as well as relief and rescue task forces organized and sent in advance by the Tatmadaw have been actively carrying out the rescue and rehabilitation activities in the areas where losses and damages occurred in the aftermath of cyclonic storm (MOCHA). In this regard:

- From 28 June to 4 July, senior military officers tasked to oversee rehabilitation activities in storm-hit areas like Kyaukpyu, Buthidaung, Mrauk-U, Ponnagyun, Myebon, Thandwe, Rathedaung, Maungdaw, Minbya and Kyauktaw of Rakhine State and Paletwa of Chin State oversaw healthcare services provided by mobile medical teams, provision of paddy seeds to locals, storage of relief supplies for storm-hit victims in consumer goods warehouse. They provided construction materials, commodities, cash

assistance as well as varieties of traditional medicine donated by traditional medicine entrepreneurs to storm-affected monasteries and local people.

- From 28 June to 4 July, relief and rescue teams sent in advance by the Tatmadaw to Sittwe, Mrauk-U, Kyaukpyu, Kyauktaw, Ponnagyun, Rathedaung, Buthidaung and Maungdaw provided necessary healthcare services to victims; conducted collective cleaning activities, transportation of rice seeds to local residents, and repaired power cables. They also provided cooking oil, water, commodities and paddy seeds to them.
- On 30 June, deputy commander of Western Command and officials provided foodstuffs for storm victims from 279 households and 10 monasteries in Ann Township of Ann District in Rakhine State.

- On 29 of June, 1 and 3 July, Maj-Gen Htin Latt Oo, commander of Western Command, and officials oversaw healthcare services to locals provided by mobile medical teams, reconstruction works of Ywathit Kay-Zaw Matak-Mingan Concrete Road in Sittwe. They provided biryani rice boxes, roofing nails and zinc-roofing sheets to the locals of Cyclone Mocha victims in Gangaw Kyun village of Sittwe Township.

military commands and responsible departmental officials encouraged the said rehabilitation activities collectively conducted by military personnel, members of Myanmar Police Force and Myanmar Fire Brigade, staff from respective ministries and civil societies, and also attended to their needs, it is reported.

Aids, Relief Materials, Supplies Transported to Victims of Cyclonic Storm MOCHA in Rakhine State



Military aircraft/helicopters and naval vessels are being used to deliver aids, relief materials and supplies to locals in Sittwe township of Rakhine state affected by the Cyclone Mocha. From 28 June to 4 July, 64 people including artists and sportsmen to personally donate the funds received from the MOCHA fundraiser and the four-way soccer tournament, and a total weight of 22.415 tonnes including relief supply donated by Indonesia and the ASEAN Coordinating Center for Humanitarian Assistance on disaster management (AHA Centre) and basic goods and basic commodities donated by well-wishers were delivered by Tatmadaw aircraft.

On 28 June, two 29-metre landing crafts from Tatmadaw (Navy) transported a total

weight of 200 tonnes including 13,613 timbers in various sizes to Sittwe.

Military aircraft/helicopters are being used to deliver aids, relief materials and supplies to locals affected by the Cyclone Mocha in a timely manner. From 15 May to 4 July, a total weight of 561.3 tonnes of relief materials and 3,542 people including military personnel and departmental staff who were to participate in rehabilitation activities, were conveyed by military aircraft. Concerned authorities received relief supplies transported by military aircrafts/helicopters and naval vessels, and they have been making arrangements to transport the supplies to storm-hit towns and villages, it is reported.

Efforts made to Increase Export Volume in the Fiscal Year of 2023-2024



During the tenure of the State Administration Council Government, efforts are being made to increase export volume via border trade posts and regular trade routes. As a result:

- Over two-month and a half period, from 1 April to 16 June in the fiscal year of 2023-2024, Myanmar shipped 335,453.56 tonnes of varieties of pulses to foreign markets via sea routes and 38,523.712 tonnes of pulses via border trade posts, earning a total of USD 292.219 million.

- Over two-month and a half period, from 1 April to 16 June in the fiscal year of 2023-2024, Myanmar-China border trade value reached a total of USD 809.613 million: USD 447.342 million for exports and USD 362.271 million for imports.

53 International cargo ships will dock at the Yangon International Port in July, it is reported.

Four Foreign Countries Impose Zero Percent Tariff for Coffee Import from Myanmar



Myanmar is currently exporting to 14 foreign countries in America, Europe and Asia regions. Notable countries such as Japan, China, Saudi Arabia and UAE offer import tariff exemption for Myanmar's coffee.

- Almost 50,000 acres of coffee plantation are cultivated across Myanmar. One tonne for specialty type of (coffee bean) is priced at around USD 7,500 and the price for a tonne of regular type (coffee bean) is USD 3,000 and 4,500.
- 90% of coffee plantation in Myanmar is Arabica coffee which is mostly cultivat-

ed in Mandalay Region and Shan State. Another 10% of coffee plantation is Robusta coffee which is mostly cultivated in Kayin State.
